Unit titles: 1) Breadth Study (40%) 1C) The Tudors: England, 1485–1603

2) Depth Study (40%) 2R) The Cold War, c1945–1991

3) Historical Investigation (non-exam assessment) (20%)

Unit 1: 1C) The Tudors: England, 1485–1603 This breadth study focuses on the trials and tribulations of the Tudor monarchy from 1485-1603. This option allows students to study in breadth issues of change, continuity, cause and consequence looking at how effectively the Tudors restored and developed the powers of the monarchy?

Unit 2: 2R) The Cold War, c1945–1991 This option provides for the study in depth of the evolving course of international relations during an era of tension between communist and capitalist powers which threatened nuclear Armageddon.

Unit 3: Historical Investigation: The focus of the historical investigation is: The changing rights and status of Black Americans in the USA and the factors that drove those changes. Students choose their own specific question linked to these period of history and write a 3000- 3500 word essay on the topic area.

**Entry Requirements:** 5 GCSE's at 5-9 including a minimum of 6 in History, and Grade 5 in English and Maths

**Possible progression routes:** Studying history at A level is seen as a facilitating subject and is seen by universities as a highly academic and diverse subject. Students that study history tend to go on to study history, law, politics and government, international studies, philosophy and English at university. The skills that you acquire at A level prepare you for the rigour of analysis and evaluation and the ability to construct detailed and analytical pieces of work. Such skills lend themselves to careers in journalism, teaching, law, communications and politics.
